

# Italian day at level best art cafe





It is estimated that more than one billion native animals will have been affected by the current drought and bushfire crisis throughout Australia, with many injured, having lost their homes and facing a tough time ahead while food resources are low.

Colchester Zoo's charity Action for the Wild is fundraising to send donations across to Australia to assist conservation organisations in their work to rescue wildlife. There is an urgent need for immediate support with placing rescued native animals for treatment, and also a longer term requirement to return healthy animals to regenerated habitats and revive and sustain populations of wildlife in affected areas.

Our funds will be sent to the Zoos Victoria Bushfire Emergency Wildlife Fund. 100% of funds raised will be used to support wildlife, in consultation with the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning to ensure it is most effectively assisting injured wildlife and their habitat. Zoos Victoria vets and keepers are at a number of triage centres across Victoria, tending to injured wildlife on the frontline and a number of animals, including koalas, have been brought back to their Healesville Sanctuary for further veterinary treatment.

St Helena Hospice is celebrating its 35th anniversary this year and will be re-telling its journey through the stories of people involved at the very beginning.

Thanks to a generous grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund, the memories of people involved in its early years will be recorded and preserved. The collection, along with historic photos and film clips, will be published online, and along the way a podcast series will be broadcast.


